The Langley Ukulele Ensemble is now in its 43rd year of Enriching Lives Through Music!

The 27 ensemble members range in age from 11 to 17 years and see themselves as entertainers and ambassadors for youth and the community of Langley. The ensemble regularly performs locally, regionally, and have performed across Canada, America, as well as in Japan, and for over 25 years they have been featured performers at the Sheraton Waikiki Resort each July. The ensemble have recorded 15 albums and were the subject of an award-winning documentary film, The Mighty Uke. The students are challenged to strive toward excellence in musical performance and to use music as a vehicle through which they can act as role models and leaders among their peers. They aim to leave audiences entertained, enriched, and with a sense of hope and optimism!



Feng E is a young musical sensation (born in 2007) from Taiwan whose expert renditions of various 'ukulele covers of popular music has turned the heads and stolen the hearts of some of the biggest stars in the world. To date, Feng E has mastered five musical instruments, starting with the piano at the age of four, with numerous compositions to his name. He has become a star in the world of ukulele music, performing and winning competitions around the world, in places like Singapore, Malaysia, Japan, China, and Hawaii. On Asia's Got Talent (2017), he was the only competitor to get the Golden Buzzer from producer David Foster. In 2018, a video of Feng E playing Tommy Emmanuel's arrangement of Classical Gas, with an ukulele in the park area of Taipei has nearly 20 million views and earned him an invitation to The Ellen DeGeneres Show to play for a worldwide audience. He has appeared twice on Ellen's show (2018 and 2019). In 2020, Feng E made it to the quarter-finals of America's Got Talent. Feng E continues composing original songs and has released his first single "8 Plus" via global digital distribution. Look for more great performances from this talented young player.

Established in a suburb of Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada in 1981, the Langley Ukulele Ensemble is made up of 28 middle and high school students whose ages range from 12 to 18 years, with a rigorous performance schedule that includes as many as 80 concerts per year locally, regionally, and internationally. Led by Musical Director Peter Luongo, they have traveled across Canada, throughout the United States, and Japan and have performed at major ukulele festivals in Honolulu, New York, Reno, and Japan. The Langley Ukulele Ensemble was also prominently featured in the award-winning documentary film the Mighty Uke: The Amazing Comeback of an Underdog and they have appeared annually at the Sheraton Waikiki resort in Honolulu, Hawaii each summer for more than 25 years. The Langley Ensemble's mission is to model excellence in musical performance while representing their community and displaying the best attributes of today's youth.

tThe annual Los Angeles International Ukulele Festival is an exciting weekend dedicated to exploring the musical versatility of the ukulele and the joy of making music. A unique, family-friendly event, the festival includes workshops for all levels of playing ability and live all-star performances by some of today's most popular ukulele players continuously throughout the day.
